TOO MUCH INFORMATION!

There is a common expression: "Too much infor-
mation!" We usually use it when people tell us details
about their lives that we don't want or need to know. To-
day, when James and John ask Jesus a simple question,
making their request for places of honor in the kingdom, a
simple answer might have been in order. Instead, as he
often does, Jesus answers a question with a question; to-
day it's about drinking the cup of suffering. Then, once
the others are indignant over James and John's outrageous
request, he proceeds to give them what may have been
"too much information" for followers who were simply
interested in the pursuit of glory. But this information,
though it can sometimes seem "too much" for us, is es-
sential for our lives as disciples. In Isaiah, in Hebrews,
and in Mark today, we learn this information: it is in suf-
fering, in weakness, in self-giving service to others, that
we come to understand the kingdom. It is the information
we need to find our place and come to be honored in the
reign of God.

Praying as a Family

“The closer people sit to each other at Mass the better they understand the meaning of Eucharist, Conversely, the farther apart people sit from each other, the less their understanding.”
Paul Bernier, S.S.S.

Does this apply to your parish? Or to your choice of a pew or seat? The point Father Bernier is making is that during Mass we are not to focus on our own individual personal piety or devotion. Rather, we gather as God's community in public worship around the table of the Lord for a sacrificial meal. We are not scattered individuals, observers of what the priest does for us. The congregation, led by the priest, offers together the sacrifice of Christ.

In most African churches on Sundays, this matter of people sitting far apart is almost never a problem. Whether the church is a small outstation or a large cathedral, Sunday Masses are often overcrowded, with standing room only. Surely that contributes to the spirit of celebration that is so apparent and tangible. In the United States by contrast, many of our large, ornate churches have diminishing numbers of parishioners. Might not one of the functions of the ministers of hospitality be to direct people to come up front and center? Then we might begin to see the congregation not scattered throughout the church but rather sitting, kneeling and even singing close together as God's family. Emmanuel Magazine Sept/Oct 2009

San Lorenzo Ruiz de Manila First Filipino Saint and Martyr A Fiesta Celebration

In Honor of San Lorenzo Ruiz de Manila
Saturday, October 31, 2009

Lorenzo was born in the Philippines about 1600. He was an active Catholic and a husband and father of three. In 1637 he was falsely accused of murder and force to leave his country. After arriving in Japan he was captured for being a Catholic. He was promised safe passage back to his family if he renounced his faith but he refused. He died a tortuous death in 1637. Lorenzo Ruiz became the first person beatified outside the Vatican when Pope John Paul II beatified him in the Philippines in 1981 and was canonized October 18, 1987 in Rome. His feast day is September 28th.
