TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Last week's Treasure mentioned the "Nuns of the Battlefield," religious sisters from several communities who served as nurses in the Civil War. Florence Nightingale had only instituted female nurses a decade before in the Crimean War, so the idea of women tending to wounded soldiers was extraordinary. The medical and sanitary conditions on the battlefields were appalling, and the sisters were nearly all teachers. Few had any medical training beyond what they had learned as youngsters in the family. Anti-Catholic prejudice was so deeply entrenched in America that sisters could not wear their habits in public. These sisters were the first, and people on both the Union and Confederate sides soon began to marvel at their bravery, efficiency, and respect for Protestant soldiers. More than six hundred sisters from twenty-one communities went to war, serving in wretched conditions. They were tough and single-minded, efficient and fearless.

After the war, sisters could appear in public everywhere in the reunited nation, and often received the praise and gratitude of grateful soldiers and family members on behalf of their sister nurses. An outdoor monument to the "Nuns of the Battlefield" stands in Washington at M Street and Rhode Island Avenue. The inscription reads: "They comforted the dying, nursed the wounded, carried hope to the imprisoned, gave in His name a drink of water to the thirsty."

The Medical Missionaries of Mary, are an international missionary congregation of women religious. We strive to look and live beyond the barriers of culture, religion and language to help the poor, the oppressed and the marginalized. We are engaged in fields of health care; curative medicine, surgery, obstetrics, public health work and in teaching hospitals. Some work in direct evangelization doing pastoral care in parishes. Still others are in various branches of social work and community development. As most diseases can be prevented if the causes are eliminated, the sisters do this by health education on how to keep the environment healthy by providing clean water, improved sanitation and housing. Our sisters are also engaged in ministry to persons living with HIV/Aids which is an urgent need in most places where we work.

We were established by a young, Irish lady named Mary Martin who went out to work in Nigeria, West Africa as a lay volunteer nurse, established the Congregation in 1937.

As many of those we serve are unable to pay for medical services, we depend greatly on the support we receive through donor agencies as well as the Propagation of the Faith. Our benefactors have a very special place in our daily prayers, and assure them of the unspoken gratitude of those we are privileged to serve.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

- People who are not baptized
- People who are baptized in another Christian religion
- People who are baptized as Catholics and have not received their First Communion (Eucharist) and/or Confirmation.
- Catholics who have not participated in the life of the church for a period of time and desire to return to their family of faith.
- Practicing Catholics who want more knowledge of their faith.

The process includes the study of scripture, Catholic worship, church tradition, doctrines of the faith, the sacraments and the ideals of the Catholic community.
