### TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading -- My word will not return to me void, but  
will achieve the end for which it was sent  
(Isaiah 55:10-11).

Psalm -- The seed that falls on good ground will yield a  
fruitful harvest (Psalm 65).

Second Reading -- We, who have the first fruits of the  
Spirit, groan within ourselves awaiting the redemption of  
our bodies (Romans 8:18-23).

Gospel -- Some seed fell on the path, some on rocky  
ground, and some among thorns. But some also fell on rich  
soil and produced fruit (Matthew 13:1-23 [1-9]).

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Two centuries ago, Archbishop John Carroll wor-  
ried that Americans would not appreciate the linguistic veil  
over our worship, and asked that the liturgy in the new  
United States be in English, not Latin. How did our liturgy  
come to be in Latin in the first place? In the first century, the  
dominant language in the regions where the church first  
flourished was Greek. Today in much of the world, almost  
everyone speaks at least a bit of English. Last year, the Euro-  
pean Union even considered making English its official lan-  
guage, a curious proposal since only one English-speaking  
country, Ireland, is a member.

Just as English is a unifying language today, it was  
hard to function in the ancient world without a smattering of  
Greek. Even the word "Eucharist" comes from the Greek for  
"thanksgiving." For a long time, Greek was the language of  
worship, even in Rome. Slowly, society in the west shifted to  
a bias for Latin and against Greek. Latin first appeared in  
public prayer at the end of the second century, in the colonial  
outposts of North Africa. Soon, Latin became the language  
of culture, and so as fixed prayer forms were written, they  
were transmitted in Latin. From Rome and Africa, over the  
next four centuries, the new liturgical language of Latin  
spread north to Gaul and Britain.
