## Forty Days For Life!

Starting on September 26, and extending through November 4, Sacramento Christian communities are uniting to demonstrate our resistance to the “status quo” that permits (and even encourages) the abortion of unborn fetuses. Sacramento is one of the 89 cities in 33 states (and the only one in California!) where the community is joining together for the largest simultaneous pro-life mobilization in history -- the nationwide *40 Days for Life* campaign.

We are praying that, with God's help, this ground-breaking effort will mark the

beginning of the end of abortion in our city and throughout America.

*40 Days for Life* is a focused pro-life campaign that consists of:

- 40 days of **prayer and fasting**
- 40 days of **peaceful vigil**
- 40 days of **community outreach**

In order to fully appreciate the magnitude of this effort, you need to pay a visit to “ground zero” of the campaign – that is, the Planned Parenthood abortion facility at 29<sup>th</sup>

and B St. in downtown Sacramento. Here, the goal is to have at least 4 people present at all times (night and day) through the forty days – keeping vigil and praying for God’s guidance for the women who are considering abortion, and for the souls of the unborn who have lost their lives there.

## Prayer for Our Troops

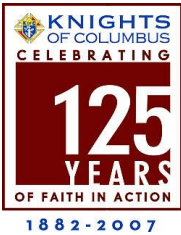

## Christopher Columbus: Discoverer of the New World

On October 12, 1492, a sailor aboard the Pinta - one of the three ships commanded by Christopher Columbus - sighted land—and the world changed forevermore. Columbus was on a voyage of discovery—not of new lands, but rather, of a new route to China. Columbus had convinced the Spanish Royalty to trust his calculations that, by sailing West, he could reach the Far East. In the strict sense of the word, Columbus’ voyage was a failure—he never did discover the route to China. But it was in the attempt—to venture beyond the horizon, to go where none had gone before, to take the risk—that Columbus blundered into the New World and began the great migration of mankind that would eventually yield the “melting pot” known as the United States of America.

As Knights of Columbus, this month we celebrate our namesake—and realize that sometimes, though we may not meet our goal, it is through our efforts and actions that we change our world.

## Bishop Quinn Returns to Sacramento

Retired Bishop Francis A. Quinn of Sacramento, who has spent the last 13 years in the Diocese of Tucson ministering to the Yaqui and Tohono O’odham nations, is returning to his native California to live in Sacramento.

Bishop Quinn served as a priest of the Archdiocese of San Francisco for 33 years. He became bishop of Sacramento in 1979 and served the diocese for 14 years. He retired in 1993.

In 1994, he moved to Tucson at the invitation of the late Bishop Manuel Moreno and became “addicted to the desert” as he fulfilled a lifetime dream to minister to American Indians.

Bishop Quinn, who during his years in Tucson lived in a motor home parked behind Tucson Bishop Kicanas’ residence, praised “the enthusiasm, the zeal” of his host, describing those qualities as “so much needed today.”

Bishop Quinn said he planned to donate the motor home to Blessed Kateri Parish to be used for a fundraiser.
