



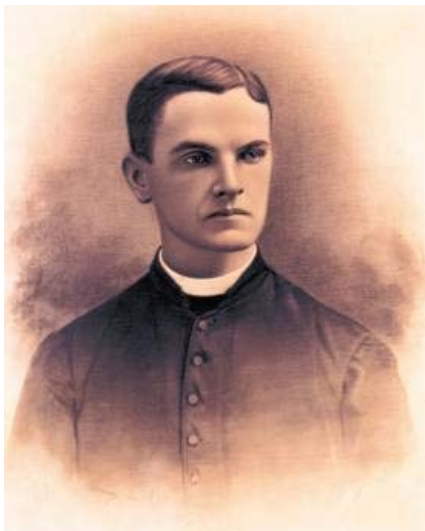

The organization has also contributed billions of dollars and millions of hours of volunteer service to charity. But as the dawning of Gods Love and Salvation is revealed with the rolling of the stone, the work of the Knights of Columbus must expand to new levels with the celebration of the 125th Anniversary of our Order. Pope Benedict XVI urged the faithful to experience "an authentic epiphany," which means that we all must first open ours hearts to Christ and we must recall the gospel passage where Jesus says, "I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide," we must feel vigorous by holy spirit to bring everyone the gift of faith, of friendship with Christ.

We have received the faith in order to give it to others; we have become members of this great Order to open our doors to other families. As we celebrate the founding of our Order we prepare for an even greater future as we live out the vision of our founder and we must continue with even greater effort to develop our parish-based councils, the family nucleus and the knowledge of our Faith. Our Holy Father has stressed the need for renewal in our parishes, and our parish-based councils are flawlessly situated to assume a strong leadership role in this important effort. In his first encyclical, *Deus Caritas Est*, Pope Benedict XVI calls for a greater commitment to the life of charity, the first principle of our Order. No doubt we will face many challenges in the future, much as we have in the past, and we must remain faithful to our Faith, our Order and our God in solidarity with our bishops and priests.

I want to thank the members our councils that have participated with our membership growth, the increase with programs and the development of our principles; but our job has just begun. California is in fourth place in the Order at the end of March, last month we were in sixth place. In March we have moved ahead of Georgia and Visayas, plus we have closed the gap with Texas for a third month in a row. Our councils are in a constant need of new energy and fresh ideas; now it's our duty to share the "Experience of a Lifetime" with every Catholic man and their family, let us help them take the final step in joining our Order. If we bring in the potential members from the form 100's received the last membership blitz, have a very strong final blitz in April and control the drops we should move to a leadership position for the Order.

We currently have 125 councils that have reached 100 percent or better with their membership quota, with four at 400 plus percent. There are another 34 councils between 99.9 and 80 percent and 15 councils between 79.9 and 75 percent. We need to ensure these councils have all the necessary requirements for Star Councils awards. This could give California 174 Star Councils awards and nothing says that the others can't do it as we have so much potential across our dioceses and parishes. Let us light up the California sky with Star Councils as we celebrate 105 years in our Jurisdiction and 125 years of the foundation of the Order. I ask your support of the of the Net 5 promotional program from the Supreme Council; three lucky Grand Knights that bring a net of five members in the fourth quarter will be invited to the 125th Supreme Convention in Tennessee.

Thank you for all your efforts and let's finish strong, so we can hand over a strong program to the 2007 – 2008 California State Team. Thank you for keeping father Michael J. McGivney dream alive; *now is the hour of the Knights of Columbus.*

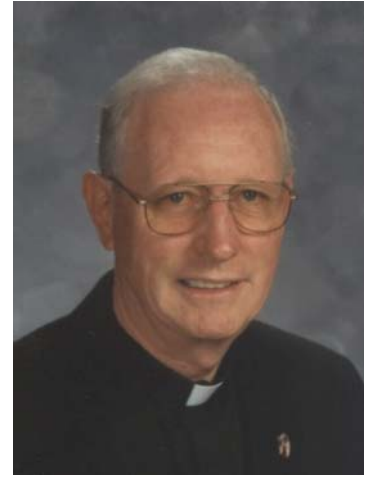


State Chaplain's Message

NET5 Promotional Incentive

Recruitment Chairman's Report

The State Council needs your help. Please make a full court press for this year's third state wide membership drive to be held April 28-29, 2007. The theme of the drive is – **“Welcome RCIA graduates”**. Make a final effort toward your membership goal. While the state is currently at 118% of our membership goal, we have way too many Form 1845s – Intent to Suspend – being processed. This is very sad. Just as sad is the number of Catholic gentleman that has not been asked to join the Knights of Columbus and provide for their families and serve their Church and community. Ask your Pastors for permission to conduct a Parish wide retreat hosted by your Councils the week prior to your membership drive. The council can provide coffee, juice, pastries or other light snacks. In addition to providing spiritual growth to attendees, it will introduce the RCIA graduates and other parishioners to one of the many functions that the knights conduct at the Parish level. Make your membership drives exciting and linked to **Faith Based Issues**.

Recruitment of new members is absolutely essential for your Council to remain strong and active. New members can bring forward new ideas for Council activities and for fund raising. They also provide the necessary volunteer force needed to support your current and future Council programs and activities. Whether prospects have a large amount of time to offer or they can only be active in a few council activities, the Knights of Columbus has a place for them and they should be shown that we have programs to suit their interests. **All you need to do is ask.**

Be sure the proposer is willing to follow through with the new candidate, by escorting him to the information night, the admission committee meeting, all degrees and the first couple of meetings. If you have Fourth Degree members with regalia in your Council ask them if they would wear their regalia to help out at the recruitment drive. It is a great way to get the attention of the families as they come out of Mass, especially the children. **All you need to do is ask.**

Your State Council Membership team is available to assist you with your recruitment efforts. Your Chapter President and your Chapter Membership Chairman are also ready to assist. However your best recruiter is usually your assigned Insurance Field Agent. He is proven quality recruiters and is available to help you with your recruitment. **DO NOT NEGELECT THIS VALUABLE ASSET. Please remember, All you need to do is ask.**

Supreme Council's Shining Armor Award Program

Due to the success of our California State Shining Armor Award Program over the last few years, Supreme has also implemented an Order-wide Shining Armor Award Program. There are some differences though between the California State Program and the Supreme Program. See the details of the California State Shining Armor Award Program on pages B-42 and B-43 of the 2006 – 2007 California Program Handbook.

The biggest difference is that the Supreme Program is only for new Knights of Columbus members. You must earn the Shining Armor Award within one year of becoming a member and you can only earn the award one time. The Shining Armor Award tracking cards, certificates, and lapel pins can be obtained from Supreme for a small fee (the tracking cards are now provided for free). There is only one type of lapel pin. The requirements are the same as our State Program except that Supreme has added the additional requirement of attending at least three council business meetings within that first year of membership. The completed tracking card should be submitted to the Grand Knight of your council who will then work with the Financial Secretary and District Deputy for an appropriate time to present the Supreme Shining Armor Award to the qualified member. The Supreme tracking cards should not be sent to the State Shining Armor Award Program Chairman since the Supreme Shining Armor Award is processed at the local council level.

The California State Shining Armor Award Program is offered to new members within their first year of membership and to those other members who have been a Knight for greater than one year. The State tracking cards can be obtained for free from the State Office. The Shining Armor Award Program Qualification Submittal Form is the only documentation that needs to be submitted to the State Shining Armor Award Program Chairman for processing of the State Shining Armor Award. The certificate, lapel pin, and letter of congratulations will be sent back to the District Deputy for appropriate recognition and presentation to the qualified member, preferably at an upcoming First Degree Exemplification. The State lapel pin does change each year with a different background color and updated to reflect the current Columbian Year so that those members who qualify each year for the Shining Armor Award will receive a different lapel pin each year.

For Columbian Year 2006 - 2007, the existing member (one who has been a Knight for greater than one year) will need to have accomplished requirements 1 – 3 on the back of the Shining Armor Award tracking card just like the new member, and sponsor two new members into the Order, between July 1, 2006 and June 30, 2007.

One additional side note this year, is that with the Rosary Bowl (see www.rosarybowl.org) scheduled for Saturday, May 19, 2007, those members who are attempting to qualify for the Shining Armor Award and who help out with ushering duties, or other logistics efforts at the Rosary Bowl, will satisfy the one requirement

of participating in three different activities under any of the categories of Church, Community, Council, Family, or Youth, by just helping out at the Rosary Bowl.

Appropriate recognition will also be made at the State Convention in May for the Council, District Deputy, Chapter, Supreme Insurance Representative, and Supreme Insurance General Agent that have the most Shining Armor Award qualifiers in their area of jurisdiction between July 1, 2006 and April 30, 2007. **Even though most of the State Reports are due to the respective chairmen by April 1, 2007 for the competition to receive awards at the State Convention, the competition to have the most number of Shining Armor Award qualifiers runs through Monday, April 30, 2007.**

Knights of Columbus Ethical Practices Qualifications Reaffirmed

IMSA renews life insurance company's place among industry leaders.

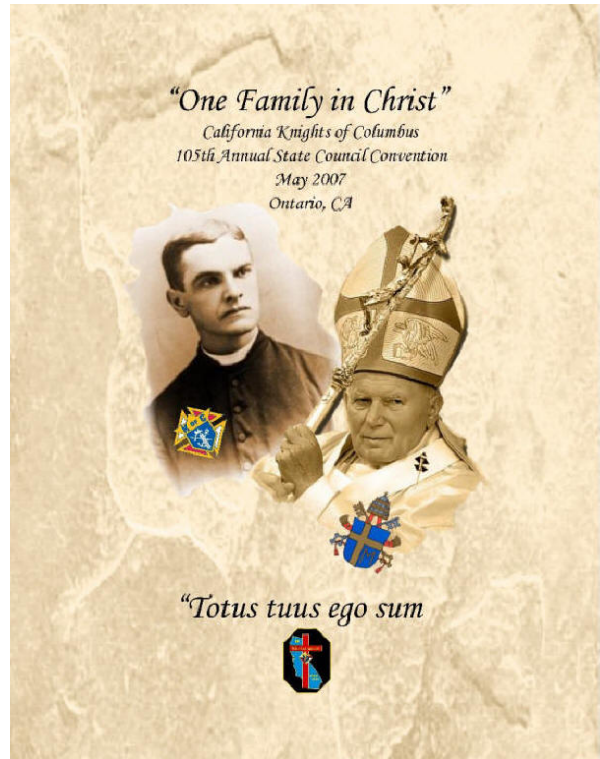

Members that have never volunteered for a KofC event before. **We would also like to invite and encourage the wives of Knights who will be ushering to help also.**

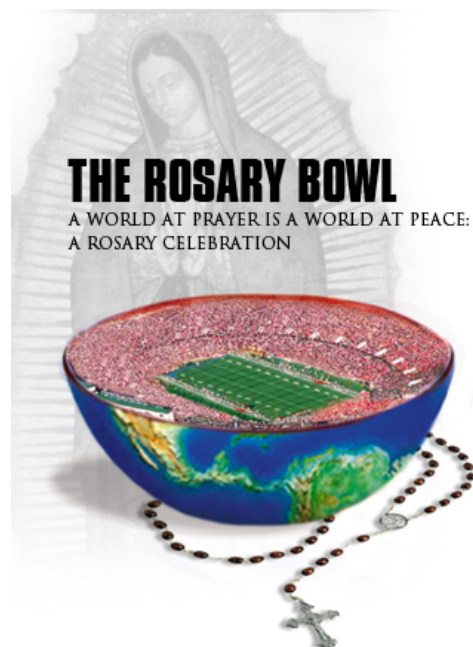
The form for signing up ushers for this event can be found on the State's web page at www.kofc-california.org.

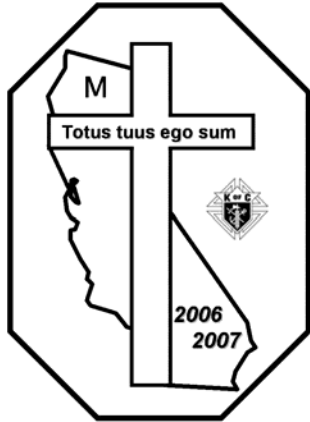
