My Brother Knights,

Next month is convention time... for the Knights of California, but mid-June will bring the 58th Annual State Circle Convention at Notre Dame de Namur University in Belmont (25 miles SSE of San Francisco and 25 miles NNW of San Jose) for the Squires. Since the Squires range in age from 10 to 17, coming up with a hundred bucks for the weekend isn't as easy for them as it may be for you, especially in these difficult economic times. And their modest payment doesn't cover the cost of the convention to the State Circle. The estimated cost of this year's convention, without linen (a sleeping bag, towel and wash cloth from home is in order), is \$12,741.00. This is based on an attendance of 115 Squires and counselors. State officers and committeemen who attend receive their room and board and are reimbursed for mileage. If all eight officers attend with eight State Council oversight people (director, assistant director(s) and committeemen) overall income is reduced. Therefore, IF (and that's a big IF) all 115 individuals attend, income only amounts to \$9,900.00, a shortfall of \$2,841.00. With an austere budget of \$5,000.00 minus the raid to help pay for last year's convention and the \$1,480.00 check written in December to cover the required liability insurance for the Squires and counselors throughout the state, reaching the bottom of the financial barrel is at hand. How can this disparity be remedied? It's really quite simple: chapters, councils, assemblies, circles, agencies, general agents, individual Knights and business people can purchase ads in the "in-house produced" convention booklet for the boys. Ads are very reasonably priced with rates as follows:

- Full page: \$100.00
- Half page: \$50.00
- Quarter page: \$25.00
- Business card: \$10.00
- Patron (one line): \$5.00

In the very near future, an ad contract will be available on this website by clicking on the "Resources" tab, then on "Forms" followed by "Circle Forms." When posted, it will be identified as "State Circle Form 2 (Convention Ad Contract)." It will be a .pdf form with fillable fields. This means it can be completed on your computer, printed and mailed with your payment and copy. If you've read any of my articles about California's Squires over the past nine months, you must agree that the boys are worth a bit of your treasure in support of "the official youth organization of the Knights of Columbus."

April 5th was a special one for the newly-elected officers of the reactivated Msgr. James F. Lawlor Circle, No. 2148, the St. Mary School-based circle. Sponsored by Escondido's Regina Coeli Council, No. 4953, the installation of officers was conducted by Chancellor Lou Silva. To add a touch of color and dignity, there was a Color Corps call-out.

Chief Counselor August Polito has quite the circle with both committed committee counselors and Squires dedicated to helping those in need.

The presenter Lee Frechette said without his help the Fourth of July might not have happened. “ It takes hundreds of volunteers to make that event go,” he said, “But sometimes the work of one makes a crucial difference. That’s certainly the case here.”

But the Knights have also reached out into the Rancho Cordova community in many other ways in recent years.

You saw them at the California Capital Air Show where they have been standout volunteers for the past three years.

Their members work magic at the Cordova Community Christmas Tree Lighting, and helped host the event for many years on the front lawn of their magnificent church on Coloma Road.

The Knights have been especially helpful at Rancho Cordova Fourth of July, organizing and staffing several all night patrols in Hagan Park, protecting equipment and tents and fireworks – even babysitting the visiting Clydesdales. Some members stayed up all night on patrol, went home and grabbed a shower and went off to other obligations. Rancho Cordova Fourth of July is indebted to the Knights.

Knights annually hold a Tootsie Roll sale fund-raiser to benefit children with mental disabilities, and collect money and buy dozens of wheelchairs for local veterans.

They even turned out to hoist up a tent when Navigator Elementary School opened so that children there would have shade during the hottest months of the school year since trees were so young they offered no relief.

This year, the national Knights of Columbus organization is once again looking for ways to serve through “Neighbors Helping Neighbors: A Summit on Volunteerism in response to the economic crisis.” We look to them for leadership.

The slogan of the Knights is: “In Service to One. In Service to All.” The Cordova Community Council honors that effort with our “Faith Leadership” award and thanks the Knights of Columbus Council 5322 for helping make our community a better, more caring place to live.

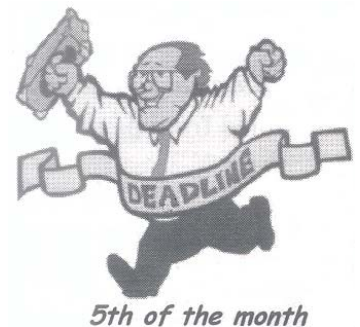
