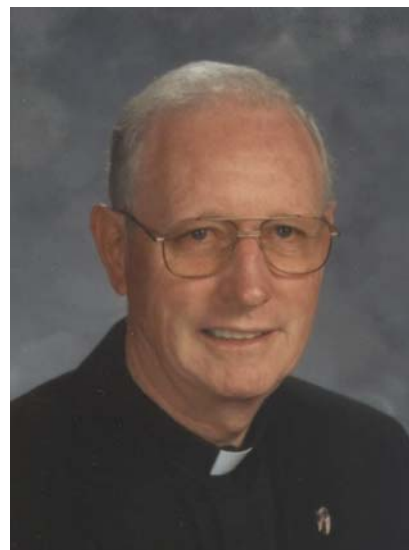

State Chaplain's Message

Greetings to you all and to your families.

I think it is true to say that before his arrival in the U.S., Americans were waiting to see and experience for themselves Benedict XVI's spirituality, intellect and humanity. They had heard many comments through the media. Upon his arrival they saw the Pope happy to be here in our midst, happy and eager to meet Americans at all levels, and the crowds responded with great excitement. Please continue to recruit qualified Catholic gentleman and make a strong effort to retain the members we have. On April 26 and 27, 2008 we held our third and last Statewide Recruit Drive of the year. It produced hundreds of prospects. We need to continue to hold information forums, followed by First, Second and Third Degrees. Please ensure sponsors accompany their candidates to all degrees. It is imperative that Insurance Field Agents be invited to the information forums and all degrees and be given a chance to speak. These professionals will enhance your event by discussing one of the main reasons why we were founded. All you need to do is ask.

The appropriate attire for all degrees is jacket and tie for candidates and sideliners. Minimum attire is slacks and a shirt with a collar. No shorts or tank tops should be allowed. We need to present a very positive image as new Knights progress through the degrees of our Order.

I mentioned RCIA graduates in my February and April recruitment articles. I have no knowledge of what the state results are for recruiting these new Catholic gentlemen, but I would like to let you know of the success of St. Michael's council 11632 in Poway CA. The council under the leadership of Grand Knight Tom Drzewiecki held a First Degree for six new members on April 23rd. All are recent graduates of the RCIA program. Five were from this year's class and one from the 2006 class. This is fertile territory and should be explored. All you need to do is ask.

As I wrote previously, why not make joining the Knights of Columbus a continuation of their formation? Let them know there is no better way to acclimate into the parish than by becoming a member of the local council. Let them know that committed knights and their families are doing their best to practice Christ's commandments. We serve our fellow man, especially those less fortunate, and standing together in Christian witness, we are a light in a world darkened by materialism, cynicism, and secular humanism. All you need to do is ask.

Last week I received a very good incentive announcement from Supreme pertaining to our Round Tables Program. Council's that have not submitted Form #2629 with the names of their Church Coordinators yet, will also count for next year as well. Do the paperwork now for this Columbian Year and you will not have to do it again after July 1, 2008 for the following year. In the process this will also give next years Team a big jumpstart towards their quota as well. It will also open the doors to starting recruitment drives earlier than usual.

With a total of 259 Round Tables already on the books, this is quite an accomplishment. However, we only added 4 new additions last month. Quebec still leads the Order with 472 but we have left all the other large States in the Union in the dust. Thanks to all your hard work this is quite thrilling for me. Taking into consideration that not too many years ago this Jurisdiction wasn't able to make the quota assigned to them.

Finally the time is at hand where the Council Officers need to start compiling the Annual Round Table Report of Activities. This is Form # 2630 located on the Supreme and State websites and the Grand Knights Handbook. You would be surprised how quickly those volunteer hours add up even with a small group of Round Table Members. It is a proven fact that Councils with an active Round Table Program far out perform those Councils without them. In addition they usually add at least three New Active Members per Parish annually. During the past 3-5 years most of your New Councils formed started out as Round Tables as well.

I know our State Convention and election of Council Offices is coming up soon but this Columbian Year ends June 30th. Just to be on the safe side with reports, I would have them to Supreme by Friday June 27th to receive credit for this year.

Pope praises Fr. McGivney as an "exemplary American priest"
Homily at St. Patrick's Cathedral cites his "vision and zeal"

(NEW YORK, NY) - During his homily at this morning's Mass for Clergy and Religious at St. Patrick's Cathedral, Pope Benedict XVI made special mention of "the remarkable accomplishment of that exemplary American priest, the Venerable Michael McGivney, whose vision and zeal led to the establishment of the Knights of Columbus." McGivney's cause for sainthood is being considered at the Vatican, and the Pope declared him a venerable servant of God in mid-March.

Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson made the following statement regarding the Pope's remarks:

"This morning, Pope Benedict reminded America's clergy that the 'secret of the impressive growth of the Church' in the U.S. was a 'unity of vision and purpose - rooted in faith and a spirit of constant conversion and self-sacrifice,' and held up as a prime example our founder, Fr. McGivney.

"The Pope's selection of Fr. McGivney as a role model for today's priests and religious is very important for us. Thousands of priests are among the 1.7 million members of the Knights of Columbus, including Cardinal Egan and hundreds of others in the Archdiocese of New York. Each and every day, all of us in the Knights of Columbus look to Fr. McGivney's vision and example as a guide to our work of charity and evangelization. At a time when our priests are in need of our support more than ever, the Pope's promotion of Fr. McGivney as a role model for clergy everywhere is both timely and enormously appreciated. We pledge our fervent support for his call to revitalize and renew the Catholic Church here and around the world."

In the early afternoon on Sunday April 6th, the Alhambra Council # 2431 of the Knights of Columbus hosted its annual Altar Server Recognition Mass at St. Thomas More Church. The Alhambra Knights have hosted Altar Server Recognition Masses annually at both St. Thomas More and St. Therese for several years, but this year for the very first time ever, the Youth Choir at St. Thomas More was also included in the festivities. Certificates of appreciation were presented to all of the boys and girls who came to the 12:30 p.m. mass and after mass they were all treated to a late pancake breakfast in the parish hall. More than 80 boys and girls, some of whom are now in college, volunteer their time throughout each year to be altar servers at St. Thomas More. There are also more than 40 boys and girls who participate in the Youth Choir. In addition to the boys and girls, a special certificate of recognition was also presented to Sr. Andrea Johnson, the music director at St. Thomas More for her work with the Youth Choir.

That evening in the parish hall at St. Therese, more than 50 religious sisters from several of the religious Orders who live and work in Alhambra were joined by several dozen Knights and their wives for a multi course dinner that featured Cornish game hen. Once again, the largest contingent came from the Carmelite Sisters, but there were also representatives from the sisters of the Community of the Holy Spirit, the Sisters of St. Columban, and the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary. After dinner, the guests of honor received tokens of appreciation from the Alhambra Council and the evening culminated with a raffle of prized quilts and gift baskets made and prepared by Carrie-Ann Cabrera, the wife of Alhambra Council's Grand Knight, Armando Cabrera.

For the second year all of the proceeds after expenses will be donated to the Wheelchair Foundation in the names of the Orders of the religious sisters who attended the dinner. 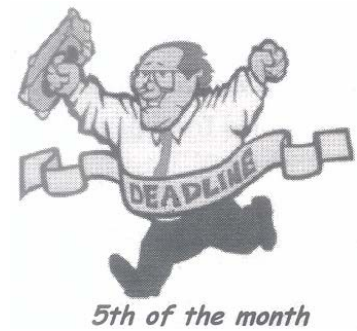

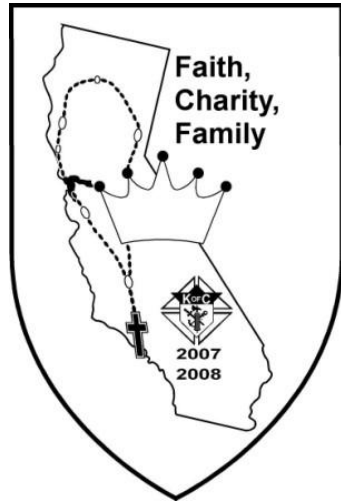
