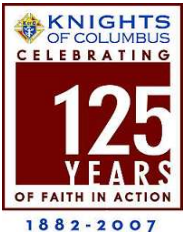

The Feast of the Assumption —August 15

The most important annual event to occur in August is the “Feast of the Assumption”, a solemn holy day of obligation. Although raised Catholic, thus having a fairly good idea as to what the Feast was celebrating, I was curious as to the history and the Church’s official stance on the subject. I found it interesting, and I would like to share it with you:

The official Church teaching on the Feast of the Assumption is that it celebrates the “assuming” of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven—that is, when the body of Mary was brought into Heaven by God. There are many competing opinions on when this event occurred, and even, where it occurred. Early writings place the event anywhere from three to fifteen years after the Crucifixion, and both Jerusalem and Ephesus (in modern day Turkey) lay claim to the physical location of Mary’s Assumption into Heaven.

There are even competing theories on whether the Blessed Virgin had died and was entombed prior to the Assumption, or if She never did die.

The position of the Church was clarified by Pope Pius XII, on November 1, 1950 in the *Munificentissimus Deus* that: “we pronounce, declare, and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory”
