Brothers:

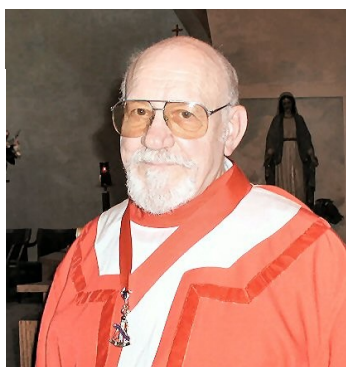
Make Note of three new resolutions adopted into the Council Bylaws at the June 8th Business Meeting:
