He was a member of the Cathedral Parish, also attending Saint Elizabeth's Church in Sacramento. He was a member, in good standing, with the Knights of Columbus. His parents Micaela Sandoval Bugarin and Marcial Sandoval Perez, as

well as his brother Joseph I Sandoval, preceded him in death. He leaves behind a sister, Kathleen from Albany Oregon and brothers; Steven from Chula Vista, Richard from Benicia, Vincent from Vallejo, Ernest from Anderson, Henry from Santa Rosa and Leo from Roseville as well as numerous nephews and nieces.
